Denver St. Jude Dream Home 2024

Denver is in full swing working on their 14th Dream Home campaign. The home, estimated at \$670,000, is built by Oakwood Homes. It is 2,700 sq. ft. finished with 5 bedrooms, 3 bathrooms, and a 2-car garage on a corner lot and is located at 4455 Piccadilly Court, Green Valley Ranch, Aurora, CO.

Tickets went on sale July 11. The sneak peek/wall signing is August 16. Open houses start Saturday, August 17, and go through Sunday, September 8, for four weekends. The hours are 10am to 5pm on Saturdays and 12pm to 5pm on Sundays. Visitors to the house will be able to register for the \$10,000 shopping spree courtesy of Furniture Row. September 13 is the Giveaway on Fox 31 and Colorado's Own Channel 2.

The new program for processing tickets for the Dream Home is a time saver in so many ways. Those volunteering in the office appreciate how streamlined the admin functions are.

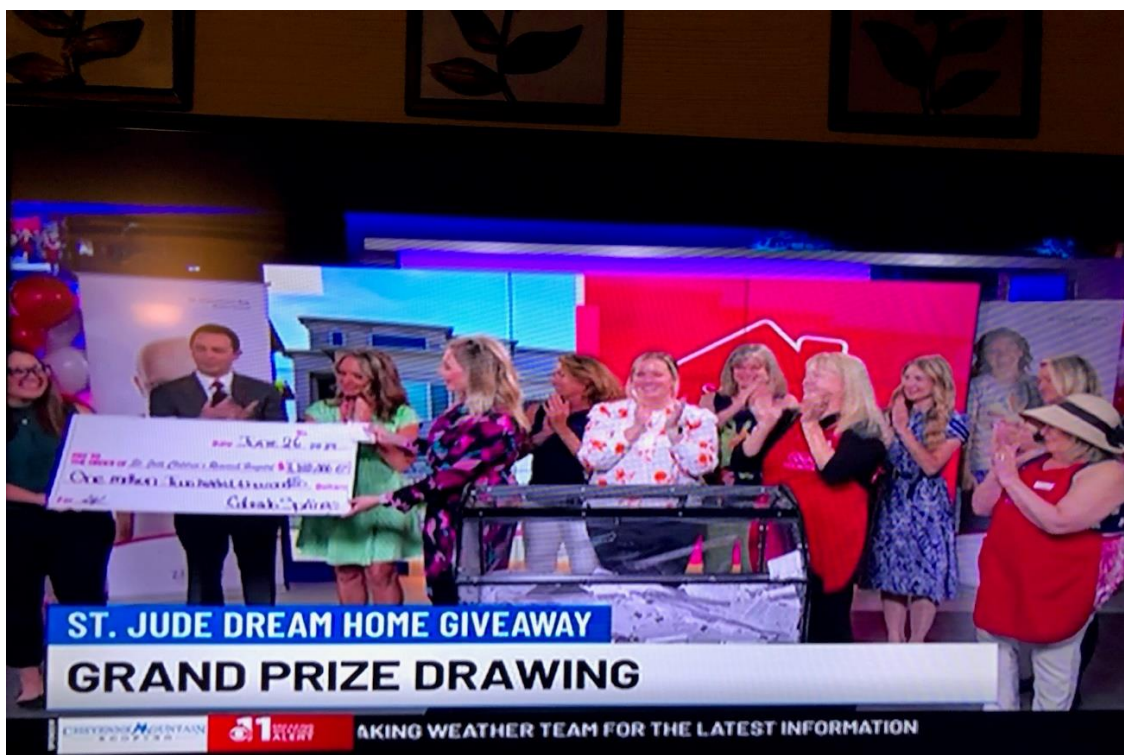

A quick trip, but so worth the wait to attend. The Awards Ceremony was very impressive to see the individuals and companies that were acknowledged for their support to the hospital.

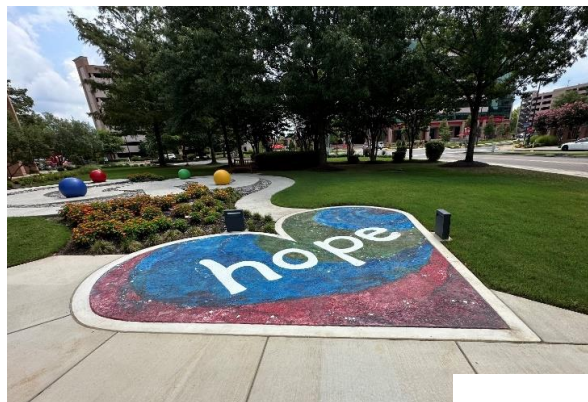

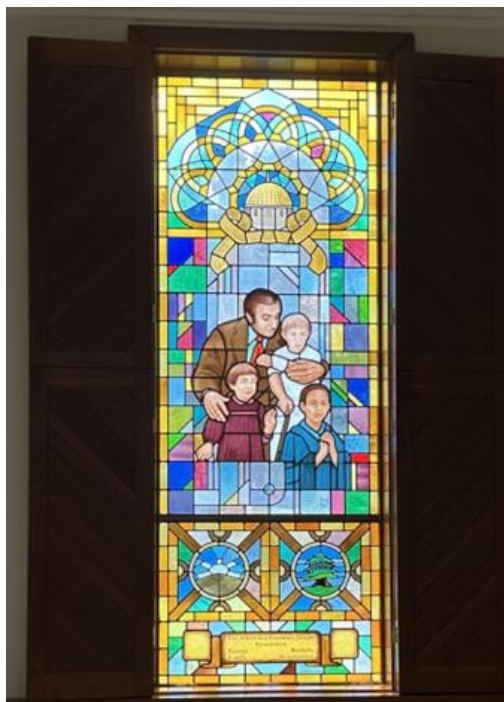
